It was clear at our 2023 Baptist Women's Worship Gathering & AGM that women were hungry for an in person, corporate experience after a few years of COVID restrictions. The Worship Gathering & AGM held Saturday, April 29 at Highland Baptist Church in Kitchener, was 2.5 hours long with approximately 100 women + online attendees.

Women enjoyed the flow of the worship, the AGM, and the message about the vision and plans for the future by Helena Bergen, CBWOQ's ED, as a continuous act of worship. One woman said they loved, "the genuine beautiful spirit throughout the entire session." The commissioning of the board by Rev. Della Bost was also a memorable moment, moving and full of the Spirit. Highland Baptist Church afforded us the opportunity to donate to their Children's Needs Distribution Centre which helps local children in need. Our women joyously contributed underwear and socks to this cause.

The Worship Gathering & AGM was small, short but filled wth God's presence. Thank you to all the women who came and made it a time of worship, joy and fellowship!

2023-2024 Uptick Co-hort

Uptick is a one-year intensive leadership training program for young women leaders

Uptick continues to be a thriving community with 5 young female leaders being developed this year. In addition to the five churches represented by these women, we have been able to incorporate teachings from alumni and top tier ministry leaders representing a further dozen churches. Discipleship and leadership go hand in hand and we are elated to see so many coming around the next generation of kingdom leaders to lift them up in prayer and practice.

As one Upticker says, "Uptick is a place where I felt encouraged, valued and heard. Uptick felt like a safe space to express myself even when I wasn't totally sure what I was saying or if it was "correct". Gracious and highly relational leadership is demonstrated and expected here and it pushed me to be a better leader where I serve."

It is our hope to offer challenge and invitation to those who are entrusted to the Uptick experience so that they can engage in their particular area of ministry with the necessary tools to build up others and draw more people towards Christ.

A Financial Snapshot

Historically, CBWOQ has had a vibrant and impactful ministry supported by a funding model that was dependent on the generosity of groups of women organized under the leadership of executive teams in our associations. Unfortunately, for the past several decades, this structure has been experiencing a steady decline as membership is aging out. Many of the associations have already disbanded. This has had a direct impact on the organization. In fact, the amount received in 2023 from associations contributions (\$134,955) reflects a 50% decrease compared to what was received in 2012 (\$270,463).

With the exception of 2013 and 2017, when significant estate funds were received, the organization has been operating in a deficit budget for over one decade. Each year, we are dipping into our investments and depleting our reserves faster than we can attract new partners to make up for the shortfall on the associations side.

To face these challenges head on, the Board committed to a strategic planning exercise in 2022. At our spring AGM and Gathering in 2023, we unveiled our new directions and priorities. But, we have often likened CBWOQ to a big ship that requires time and careful navigation to change its course.

The assurance we have is that we are not going down like the Titanic! At least, not yet... In recent weeks, we were notified of a sizeable estate for which we were named a beneficiary and we were once again reminded that our Wonderful God is THE One manning this ship. As further strategic actions are being undertaken in 2024, we have hope that over the next few years we will see the trajectory change. We pray for your continued support and trust as we navigate these uncharted waters.


