In my role, I have the privilege of partnering with our CBOQ churches to encourage, equip, and accompany women on their faith journeys. This past year, we focused on creating spaces where women could grow spiritually, experience transformation through God's love, and build connections. Our goal is to help women live as apprentices of Jesus.

Guided by the words *To Be with Jesus. Become Like Him. Do as He Did.* from John Mark Comer's Practicing the Way—we have put discipleship into action:

- Over 100 women engaged in leadership development, book studies, and other groups.
- 125 women attended Soul Days.
- Women from over 40 churches participated, strengthening our network of faith.

We also hosted events where authors and key voices shared wisdom and insight. A highlight was hearing from Beth Allison Barr, whose message deeply resonated. One woman reflected, "That night has propelled me forward... it impressed on me God's love for women." Moments like these remind us of the power of gathering to learn, be encouraged, and grow together.

Another particularly inspiring story is that of a woman who joined our Sensible Shoes study. Through that experience, she deepened her walk with God, found renewed confidence in her calling, and was inspired to start a women's ministry in her own church. What began as personal reflection has now become a space for other women to encounter God, build community, and grow in faith together. Her story is one of many like it.

We also responded to an expressed need for a ministry wives' group. Women had reached out craving this type of connection, and at CBOQ Assembly, the need became even clearer when over 35 women signed up. This group has been a gift—women sharing vulnerably about the unique challenges and joys of being a ministry wife. These gatherings have become a rich space for support, encouragement, and community.

Throughout the year, we engaged with women at various events, including Yorkminster Park Women's Day, CBOQ Assembly, Elim Baptist Women's Retreat, Montreal Women's Retreat, and the ARMBA Association gathering. These moments of connection allowed us to hear women's hearts, share wisdom, and continue building a strong, supportive network.





Looking back on this past year, I'm so grateful—for the women who have shown up, the stories we've shared, and the ways God has been at work, both in big moments and in the quiet ones.



There is no doubt that 2024 was a hard year for the organization. We stepped into 2024 with a lot of hope, but also with just as much uncertainty. As we forged ahead, guided by the strategic planning exercise we completed in 2022, and the new directions and priorities we unveiled in 2023, it was in 2024 that the hard decisions were implemented. It was time to tear down...

We had to lay down Live magazine, the centerpiece of the organization, with its roots going back 146 years. This was hard for many of you. It was hard for us too. We bid farewell to some longtime staff. This was difficult for us to do. As an organization, we went through this "weeping" and "mourning" period.



In 2024, our mission work was a testimony to God's enduring faithfulness as we served, empowered, and joined women in Canada and around the world.

Bringing Them to Safety

Under the leadership of Julaine Palmer of Trent Valley and with the support of CBOQ's refugee program, the sponsorship application for Robina and Nazia was successfully submitted and is now in process. We were deeply moved in a June Zoom meeting with the sisters, held just hours after Robina's release from the Thai Immigration Detention Centre. Hearing her story firsthand strengthened our resolve to walk with them in this journey. Julaine, whose dedication to refugee sponsorship is unwavering, touched us with stories of her involvement in the lives of individuals hoping for a new life in Canada.

Strengthening Women in Mission

Throughout the year, we had the privilege of supporting and encouraging women and women's groups in our churches as they carried out vital mission work in their communities. Their faith in action continues to make a profound difference.

Partnership Missions

Through the Canadian Baptist Women's Great Canadian Bible Study, we raised awareness and funds to empower youth in Kenya through health education and mentorship. In addition, four high-impact women leaders in Rwanda, Kenya, and Lebanon received international scholarships, strengthening their influence and leadership capacity.

Walking the Path of Reconciliation

As part of A Good Way, we participated in the National Learning Circle in which denominational partners of Canadian Baptist Ministries gather regularly to develop resources for fostering right relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples.

The Power of Global Prayer

Prayer remains at the heart of our mission. Through BWNA and BWA-Women's Day of Prayer grants, we empowered women worldwide to engage in global mission, supporting efforts in evangelism, discipleship, poverty alleviation, violence prevention, economic empowerment, and next-generation leadership.

The Strength of Our Networks

The power of our work lies not just in individual efforts but in the strength of our connections. The relationships we have, the wisdom we share, and the support we offer one another enable us to truly make a difference. Together, we are part of something far greater than ourselves, and we are deeply thankful for the women of CBWOQ and our national, North American and global families.
